**WHEREAS** City Council received approval from the Drainage Tribunal for permission to appoint Robinson Consultants Inc. to vary assessments under Section 76 of the *Drainage Act* for the Central Pittsburgh Drain – Main Branch and review the requirements of the other branches that form part of the Central Pittsburgh Drainage System (Area), and;

**WHEREAS** the Rural Affairs Advisory Committee met on January 19, 2005 and recommended acceptance of the Robinson Consultants Inc. November 2004 Engineer's Report, Central Pittsburgh Municipal Drain, Reassessment Schedules, following a public meeting and comments received as recorded in the Rural Affairs Advisory Committee Minutes;
